Evans Training Center (ETC) is a 40-week residential, faith-based program for men seeking lasting transformation through Christ. It's a regeneration ministry—not just a fresh start, but a new life. It is led by ordained ministers and staffed mostly by former addicts who've found freedom in Jesus.



FACT (Foster & Adoption Care Team) ministry provides support and encouragement to church members who are currently involved in foster care or adoption or desire to start the process. FACT also provides on-ramps to individuals, families, and small groups to support foster and adoptive families.



His Storehouse Food Pantry is a ministry of Church at The Mill that embraces neighbors in need with caring relationships by providing food services filled with items neighbors can shop for in the pantry. Neighbors in need are those in our community who do not have access to life's daily food necessities, and volunteers have an opportunity to build relationships with neighbors while helping assist with daily needs.



Hope Remains Ranch provides counseling, therapy sessions, and biblically based mentorship through equine therapy. They serve local children, adults, and families to focus on healing with trauma resolution and marriage and family counseling. Additionally, they focus on various diagnoses including ADHD, ADD, Oppositional Defiant Disorder, anxiety, depression, PTSD, and others.



Mobile Meals has members of our community dedicate time each weekday to deliver a nutritious, hot meal to our homebound neighbors throughout Spartanburg. Mobile Meals is much more than a meal. Mobile Meals delivers love, compassion and hope to our neighbors in need.



Operation Christmas Child is a seasonal ministry through Samaritan's Purse that provides shoeboxes full of Christmas gifts to children all over the world. This is a great opportunity for small groups and individuals to serve our neighbors around the world. Usually boxes are distributed during October and collected in November to then be mailed internationally.



Southeastern Children's Home's mission is to provide care to needy children and families through group home care, foster care, adoption, maternity care, and counseling.
