# A NOTE FROM PASTOR D.J.

Frances Genoble and her husband, Don, are with Jesus now. But when I became the pastor of this church, they were the sweetest, most encouraging elderly couple in our fellowship. After Don's death, Frances stayed as active as her health would allow. Always grateful for everything God bestowed upon her, she lived a simple life of Christlike contentment. One day, the front office called to tell me Frances was asking for me. I walked up front to find her smiling with excitement. She could not wait to tell me what she had done. She said, "Pastor, I don't have a lot to give, but today I sold most of my gold jewelry so that I could make a special offering to our efforts to build a new church."

Needless to say, I was stunned. Instead of receiving it willingly, the grandson in me welled up, and I gently rebuked her, saying she did not have to do that with such important keepsakes. She quickly put me in my place, saying, "Nonsense, my old fingers are arthritic, and none of my rings fit anymore. This is exactly what I wanted to do, and I'm honored to help our church."

Frances reminded me that day how God provides for His church. He leads His faithful to love and give. Sometime after her gift, on November 23, 2015, Frances called and left me the sweetest voicemail expressing her love for me. You might wonder how I remember the exact date of her call. Well, it's easy. I still have it on my phone. I've never deleted it, and in fact, I played it at her funeral a few years later.

She gave, and she loved.

This is the call of God on all of our lives.

Enclosed is the plan we will use to make sure that when you love and give to our church, every penny is used in a way that fuels our mission of being a deeply-faithful, remarkably-healthy, highly-impactful, multi-site church.

As you reflect on this and begin to take in the information in this document, I have a few requests. First, I want you to read this carefully and thankfully. We really should worship when we see the tangible testimony of God's provision. Second, I want you to feel free to approach any of our leaders with questions about how we manage and invest your tithes and offerings. Finally, I also want you to realize the amazing opportunity and responsibility you have to help us make these numbers a reality. Budgets are nothing more than prayerful plans and projections. While vital, they don't produce money or fund ministry. You and I have to do that. I hope you and your family will join Laurel and me in giving sacrificially and faithfully next year. Can you imagine what the next decade holds for us?

# For Worship & Small Groups

The church has always gathered for two reasons: corporate worship and making disciples. Gathering for worship focuses on our vertical relationship with God as we worship Him and hear from His Word, and we believe He will continue to bless His church. Gathering in Small Groups focuses on our horizontal relationships and connects us with others for spiritual growth, real relationships and gospel conversations. Resources in this budget fund our Worship and Small Group ministries, allowing us to provide Bible study curriculum, training resources, discipleship materials, Small Group events, equipment, administrative personnel, building and facilities upkeep, and debt retirement. Ultimately, the budgeted resources allow us to further God's work by worshiping Him and making disciples.

# **Adult Discipleship**

We believe that all followers of Christ need to be genuinely loved through a **Small Group**, specifically trained through an **Equipping Class**, intentionally challenged through a **Mentor Group**, or compassionately helped through our **Biblical Counseling** ministry as they seek to grow in their walk with Christ. This fourpart strategy allows us to maximize Adult Discipleship across all three of our campuses.

- We have 2,376 individuals participating in Small Groups across all three campuses.
- We currently have 2,926 individual participants in at least one of our four discipleship environments across all three of our campuses.
- Adult Discipleship at our Lake Cooley Campus boasts 272 people participating in Small Groups and Equipping Classes.
- We continue to see growth in Adult Discipleship at our Woodruff Campus, with 325 people participating in discipleship.
- Fall 2025 saw the largest number of people ever to register for discipleship with 619 registrations for small groups and 250 registrations for equipping groups across all three campuses.

# In Quiet Time & Discipleship

In addition to Small Groups, two of the most powerful ways God grows us includes our personal quiet time with Him and through discipleship. At Church at The Mill, our ultimate goal is to make disciples who make disciples. Dollars in this budget fund the spiritual formation of our children, students, and adults, as well as funding our biblical counseling program.

## Did you know? In 2025...

- NextGen Ministry has onboarded and trained over 200 new Adult Volunteer Leaders who are now
  on the front lines of discipleship to the next generation with our team of nearly 800 adult leaders
  who are making a difference.
- NextGen ministries have served 4,382 kids and students through gospel-centered weekly programming on the campus of CATM.
- NextGen ministries shared the gospel with over **1,800** individuals involved in our VBS/VBX, and over **600** individuals in United Student Camp.
- Over 815 students and adult leaders experienced our life-changing United Student Weekend.
- All-Access Ministry has faithfully served over 180 individuals with special needs through weekly programming, making the gospel available to everyone!
- In NextGen Ministry, we have baptized over 100 kids and students to date in 2025.

## BIBLICAL COUNSELING

The Biblical Counseling Ministry exists to care for people who are hurting and to equip future counselors to do the same. We are accomplishing this by intentionally increasing the number and quality of certified biblical counselors through our ACBC Certified Training Center.

# Because of your generous giving, our biblical counseling ministry was able to...

- Successfully complete a rigorous year-long, six-phase certification process to become an ACBC Certified Training Center. This means that CATM may now train and certify our own biblical counselors through ACBC-approved material right here on our campuses.
- Provide Christ-centered counseling to over **200** CATM church attendees this year. Since January 1, we've received **186** new requests for counseling. This has resulted in over **1,800** hours of counseling, which has brought hope, healing and restoration to the lives of many.
- Invest in current and future counselors, by providing over **40** hours of large group theology and counseling training in ACBC Fundamentals, ACBC exam classes and advanced counseling training.
- Equip at least **66** men and women with practical counseling training, from basic fundamental counseling training to continuing education hours.


# Financially & Through Service

Dollars in this budget reflect our giving as a church body by means of tithes and offerings, which are separate from the financial gifts given to Acts 1:8 and More Than Ever. Tithes and offerings are used to pay for all the operational expenses of Church at The Mill, including facility, administrative and ministry expenses, while also investing in local and international missions. God has blessed our church deeply as it ministers to more people than ever before, both within our church walls and outside, as we strive to encourage and strengthen like-minded churches!










# **Share The Gospel**

The gospel is not a "come see" religion. It is a "go tell" message of redemption! We are called to go into the world to make disciples, and we do this primarily in two ways; (1) We share our faith daily with those around us (locally). (2) We leave our daily lives to engage those we do not normally encounter (internationally).

# Did you know?

- His Storehouse Food Pantry at Lake Cooley serves over 30 families each month by providing healthy canned goods, fresh meat, and produce.
- In 2025, we will give over \$500,000 combined to organizations like the International Missions Board (IMB), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and the Southern Baptist Cooperative Program to help send missionaries and church planters to the mission field.
- Each month, we serve over 90 families in need by providing household goods through the His Storehouse ministry at our Central Campus.
   We help provide hygiene supplies, household cleaning products, paper goods and other things so our neighbors can budget their funds, often their fixed income, in other areas.
- Each year, we designate funds to operate the Upstate Missions
   Conference. In 2025, we hosted hundreds from CATM and people from 24 other churches who came to be equipped for serving locally and around the world.
- This year we helped provide funds to support 24 local ministry partners, 10 international partners and domestic church plants. Because of the generosity of our annual giving, we are able to say 'yes' and proudly partner with organizations making a difference for the kingdom.







# PREPARING FOR 2026

God has richly blessed our church to prepare us for 2026. In 2025, your faithful giving allowed Church at The Mill to continue to grow and reach more people than ever before. We have seen an average of 600 more people attend a Sunday service compared to 2024. In fact, your investment in Church at The Mill has resulted in having a place to worship, resulting in more baptisms, more students, more children, and more people involved in Small Groups than ever before! Also, 2025 marks the first full year where we have 5 congregations across three campuses! We are thrilled to see how God is using Church at The Mill for His glory!

In 2026, we will need to invest more in our ministry areas to meet the higher participation levels we are experiencing. We want to make sure our ministries are positioned for success as they encounter the growing demand from people of all ages wanting to grow and develop in their faith.

In addition, we will be increasing our facilities investments across our campuses, simply to meet the needs of our growing church attendance. From cleaning supplies to added security, all aspects of our facilities have growing needs.

Lastly, we will be increasing our Missions budget by another \$100,000, bringing our total missions giving (from our general offering) to \$1,900,000. This amount represents 20% of our total budget that is earmarked for missions. We are so thankful for how God continues to bless the growth of His church!

# **Continued** focus on debt reduction...

Over \$800,000, or 8% of our 2026 budget, is dedicated to capital funding and debt retirement. This is above and beyond the amount received by our congregation's generous gifts designated to reduce our current debt through More Than Ever.
